Each paper submitted will be blind peer reviewed to ensure quality, technical accuracy, and maximum interest to our readers. They will also be checked for plagiarism.

All papers submitted should:

- Clearly relate to the aims and scope of the journal (this is the most common reason for rejection)
- Justify all claims with evidence and without exaggeration
- Should be written in clear, concise and readable English (this is the second most common reason for rejection)

## TYPES OF PAPERS

**Original Articles** - should not exceed 8 000 words

**Clinical Breakthroughs** – should not exceed 6 000 words

**Commentary** - should not exceed 1 200 words plus one table or figure and up to 10 references

**Perspectives** - should not exceed 6 000 words

**Reviews** - no more than 5 000 words

## FORMAT OF SUBMITTED PAPER

- Please format your paper so that is in **1.5 line spacing**
- Please include **all figures and tables within your paper**
- References should follow the **IEEE style of referencing**
- Please submit your paper in **PDF format**. (If after review, your paper is accepted, you will be asked for an MS Word (.doc) file of your paper)
- Papers should not exceed 8,000 words

## FILES TO UPLOAD

1. **Article** - your paper including a minimum of 4 keywords in the format detailed above.
2. **Title Page** - a separate title page should be uploaded which includes the title of your paper, all authors full names, emails, affiliations. *An institutional email is required for the corresponding author.*

3. **Acknowledgements** – please supply any acknowledgements separately to the main text to facilitate anonymous peer review. This can include details of author contributions to the paper. (e.g. X provided intellectual advice. Y performed analysis. Z wrote the paper)
4. **Figures** - all figures from your paper should **also be uploaded as separate files** and given a file name corresponding to the figure number. All **images** must be submitted with a **resolution of at least 500dpi**. *Scanned figures are not acceptable. Figures should be uploaded in the format they were created.*
5. **Tables** – all tables from your paper should **also be uploaded as separate files** and given a file name corresponding to the table number.
6. **Key Findings** – please provide 3 key findings, or three sentences to highlight the significance of your paper. This should be uploaded as a separate file called Key Findings

### **Further considerations**

- Make sure your paper has been 'spell checked' and 'grammar checked'.
- Ensure all references mentioned in Reference List are cited in the text, and *vice versa*.
- Ensure permission has been obtained for use of copyrighted material from other sources (including the Internet) and state the relevant creative commons license for open access materials.
- Ensure all figure and table citations in the text match the files provided.

## **STRUCTURE OF YOUR ARTICLE**

### **Title of paper**

Titles are limited to *80 characters, including spaces*. Titles should clearly reflect the content of the manuscript.

### **Abstract**

Please provide a maximum 300-word summary of the paper. This should be a concise reflection of the aims, conclusions and include interesting or important results. In particular, please specify the articles' relevance to the journal.

### **List of notations and abbreviations**

Please provide a list of symbols, abbreviations and definitions used in the text.

### **Keywords**

Please supply at least 4 keywords that may be used for indexing.

### **Appendices**

Additional information, such as tables or mathematical calculations/derivations can be included and should be clearly referred to, from the main text, as belonging to the appendix.

## **Acknowledgements**

Please provide details from those individuals and institutions that contributed to the paper. For example:

Funding: This work was supported by the Organization 1 [grant numbers xxxx, yyyy]; Organization 2, [grant number zzzz].

This research did not receive any specific grant from funding agencies in the public, commercial, or not-for-profit sectors.

Author X provided intellectual advice. Author Y performed analysis. Author Z wrote the paper.

## **Ethics**

Any associated safety, environmental or ethical issues should be declared and stated in the submission form and manuscript. A statement concerning any conflicts of interest should be included.

## **Mathematical equations**

Only relevant equations should be included in the main text and should be numbered – anything else can be added as an appendix or as supplementary information.
